#### Background

The naming rights agreement for Glenelg Oval was due for reconsideration in December 2008 and it is appropriated that council now reconsider this matter.

The Glenelg Oval is on the Community Land register; both this and councils policy on naming local reserves would suggest that the matter of a naming rights agreement needs community consultant.

The original lease for the Glenelg Oval was taken out on the 15th November 1901

Council needs to recognise the historic value of the name Glenelg Oval and the value the community is now placing on history.

This may be a way for the community to continue to benefit from the Function centre promoted by councillors at the time (2001) as a replacement for the Glenelg Town Hall.

Over the next 10 years we will face an increasing challenge in maintaining Glenelg as a tourism destination. The loss of the cinema in Jetty road, The Tram running to Semaphore which has a cinema, wide open street and retention of much of it historic character will present the need to ensure the name "Glenelg" is used in promotions at every opportunity.

Let's maximise the potential of 108 years of tradition "Glenelg Oval" the name proudly owned and promoted by the City of Holdfast Bay.

#### Background

On a recent research project I had the opportunity to visit a number of other metropolitan libraries and have formed the opinion that even with a significant injection of cash we may end up with a second rate facility compared with what other local government area enjoy.

I also took the Christmas break to read the People for Places Document "A guide for public libraries" and believe that the assessment matrix would also lead us to a second rate facility.

The People for Places Document "A guide for public libraries" also suggests that the structural integrity of an old building may not be sufficient to support the enormous floor load, shelves full of books place on the structure and on its foundations. Floor loading shall comply with AS 1170.1.

I see it is a waste of money having the committee deliberate on an outcome that may be unacceptable to the community and structurally impossible to achieve in the existing church building.

#### General Manager, Ms Thomas's comment.

In relation to part two of the motion, it would be appropriate to undertake a feasibility study to determine the suitability of the 25 Moseley Street, Glenelg property being converted to a public library however in deliberating on this matter, Council should also consider the likely cost implications to ensure there is genuine commitment to undertaking a feasibility study and as such, a real possibility of the Moseley Street property being used as a library.

It would be necessary to engage a specialists to undertake a comprehensive feasibility study (note that library specialists 'CAVAL Collaborative Solutions' were engaged in early 2008 to undertake the library service review). An alternative would be a more limited assessment by Council Administration on the suitability of the building for this purpose, however this would not explore the range of issues, in particular best library practice and future library service trends, that a detailed evaluation by a specialist would canvas. Given the significant cost and community service implications that would result from the relocation of the Gleneig Library to an alternative site, it is recommended (subject to this option being a real possibility) that Council invest in a comprehensive feasibility study of the option suggested in order to gain a solid understanding of the issues, opportunities and risks.

#### Background

COUNCIL

In recent times most new bridge constructions have been dedicated to prominent local people who have contributed significantly to their community (e.g. the new bridge constructions at Port Adelaide), one of which was named after Lt T C (Diver) Derrick VC. I am of the opinion that when the present King Street Bridge is reconstructed it should be renamed "The Kibby Bridge". Sgt. Kibby was a Glenelg resident when he enlisted in the Second World War and through his courage in battle had the distinction of being awarded the Victoria Cross one of only two South Australians to be honoured with this coveted award for valour during the Second World War.

Mrs S M Kibby received her late husband's Victoria Cross. The Cross was accompanied with a citation which was printed verbatim, word perfect in the Glenelg History Book pages 316-317. Mrs Kibby was a long term resident of Glenelg, later lived at Kingston Park with her elder daughter, Mrs Clarisse Massey. A short time ago Mrs Massey moved to Queensland to live with her younger sister. Mrs Massey for many years was involved with caretaking with Kingston House as her home was opposite located in Cygnet Terrace.

During the 1995 "Australia Remembers" year, I assisted Dr Bill Gammage who was given the task of writing the history of VC recipients. Dr Gammage is now based in Canberra and is one of Australia's foremost military historians. For further interest, a copy of Dr Gammage's submission to the Commonwealth Government for the compilation of "100 Greatest Australians" was presented for Members' information.

# Vacant Tenancy – Glenelg Town Hall - Extension for Use as Exhibition Space (Report No: 28/09)

Given that the future of the Glenelg Town Hall and Bay Discovery Centre has not been determined at this point in time (currently being considered by the Glenelg Town Hall and Community Services Advisory Committee), this report recommends that Council endorse the continued use of the former Rodney Fox Shark Experience tenancy space, located on the ground floor of the Glenelg Town Hall, for the purpose of exhibitions and activities in conjunction with the 2009 Fringe Festival and SA History Week, or alternatively, for the extension of the current arrangements with SA artist David Archer. This would in effect provide Administration with the flexibility to utilise the space for exhibitions and associated artistic activities whilst providing the community with opportunities to engage in cultural activities during two significant state events. An extension of the existing Archer's Arcadia display is also a possibility, subject to the final space requirements of the Fringe Festival exhibition.
