









Holdfast Bay residents are one of the best recyclers in South Australia with around 70% of all our waste being composted or recycled!

As a resident of the City of Holdfast Bay, you can access a wide range of services for reusing, recycling and disposing of unwanted household items and materials.

### EACH HOUSEHOLD IS ENTITLED TO



One 240L green lidded food & garden organics (FOGO) bin (serviced weekly)



One 240L yellow lidded recycling bin (serviced fortnightly)



One 140L red lidded landfill bin (serviced fortnightly)

# A SUSTAINABLE SERVICE

Our sustainable kerbside service makes recycling your food scraps easy and provides many benefits, including:

- Providing a kitchen caddy for your food scraps.
- Reducing smell from food waste by collecting food and garden organics on a weekly basis.
- Reducing landfill greenhouse gas emissions by reducing organic waste in our landfill.
- Improving our soils through the processing and return of nutrient rich compost back into our South Australian soils.
- A large, 240L capacity food and garden organics (FOGO) bin, especially useful for those with a big garden around spring and autumn.
- Supporting our community to reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill.
- No extra cost for the sustainable service.

# A FLEXIBLE SERVICE

We understand that our residents have different needs and so we provide a flexible service. If you are on our sustainable service we can upsize your recycling or general waste bins.

### NEED MORE COMPOSTABLE BAGS?

Households are eligible for one roll of 75 compostable bags per year. Additional rolls of 75 compostable bags are available for purchase from the Brighton Civic Centre and Glenelg Library at cost price. Alternatively, a number of local supermarkets (Woolworths and some Foodlands) now use kitchen caddy compatible compostable bags for fresh produce purchases.



# DON'T HAVE A KITCHEN CADDY?

A kitchen caddy makes it easy to collect your food scraps in your kitchen. You can collect a kitchen caddy from the Brighton Civic Centre or Glenelg Library.

# NEED THE OLD SERVICE?

Whilst we strongly encourage everyone to give weekly FOGO a go, we understand the service may not suit everyone. To opt out back to the old weekly landfill service please call customer service on 8229 9999 to discuss your collection options.

Households that opt out of our sustainable service will receive:

- 140L red landfill bin collected weekly
- 240L green FOGO bin collected fortnightly
- 240L yellow recycling bin collected fortnightly



### WHAT ABOUT **COFFEE CUPS?**





To check that a coffee cup is compostable, and can go in your green organics (FOGO) bin, look for the compostable logo on your cup.

Food scraps, greasy pizza boxes, shredded paper, paper based kitty litter, tissues and serviettes go in your green FOGO bin

### NEVER IN ANY BIN



NO large logs or stumps



NO cooking or motor oil

NO LPG gas cylinders

Take these to your nearest transfer station

### NO BUILDING WASTE



NO building waste or bricks



NO soil, sand or rocks



NO concrete sheeting



NO glass

### NO E- WASTE OR BATTERIES

Batteries are the main cause of fire in

bin collection trucks and at recycling facilities. Many supermarkets now have

speciality recycling bins for batteries.

Small ewaste and household batteries can be dropped off at Brighton Civic Centre or at your local transfer station.


### **BIN COLLECTIONS**

#### **PLACING YOUR BIN**

To ensure your bins are emptied on your scheduled collection day, you need to:

Put the bins out by 6am on the day of pick up and bring them back in within 24 hours of collection.

- Face each bin towards the road wheels towards the house
- Be sure your waste is not packed too tightly (keep your bin's weight under 50kg)
- Don't overfill your bin and make sure the lid can be closed



#### **CORRECT BIN PLACEMENT**

Where practical keep a minimum distance of 30cm between bins and 1m between bins and parked cars, letterboxes, stobie poles, overhanging trees etc.


Use the calendar key on the back of the Waste Calendar to determine your landfill and recycling collection week.

### **QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE**

#### **GREEN FOOD AND GARDEN ORGANICS BIN**

Food	All raw and cooked food scraps including fruit, vegetables, bread, meat and dairy
Garden cuttings	Branches up to 15cm in diameter
Paper	Shredded paper, serviettes and tissues
Compostable bags	NO plastic or biodegradable bags
Dog waste	Loose or in compostable bag
Paper based kitty litter	
Paper based straws	Most straws are now paper based and can go in your FOGO bin
Sugarcane and bamboo cutlery	

### YELLOW RECYCLING BIN Keep items loose. NO plastic bags

Hard plastic packaging	Milk containers, biscuit trays, aerosol lids
Hard household plastic	Tupperware containers, toys, buckets, plant pots
Metal	foil trays, cans, tins, aerosols
Paper and cardboard	
Glass	Jars and bottles only
Aluminium foil	Squashed into a ball

#### **RED WASTE BIN**

Soft plastics	Cling wrap, plastic bags, biscuit wrappers, zooper dooper tubes, bubble wrap
Foam	Polystyrene, styrofoam, food trays and containers
Household glassware	Wine glasses, drinking glasses, pyrex, mirrors
Clothing, material, shoes	Consider donating or giving away Damaged items go in the waste bin
Smoke alarms	Up to 2 alarms a week as approved by the Environmental Protection Authority (SA)

### **NEVER IN ANY KERBSIDE BIN**

The items below do not go in the kerbside collection bins. Many items are now banned from landfill and penalties may apply.

### **ELECTRONIC WASTE**

Batteries (alkaline / NiCad / car / powertool / button)	Take to Brighton Civic Centre or your nearest Unplug N Drop location. Many supermarkets now have speciality recycling bins for batteries
Computers / televisions	Take to your nearest Unplug N Drop location or include in your free on-call hard waste collection
Whitegoods / other electrical items	Take to your nearest Unplug N Drop location or include in your free on-call hard waste collection

#### **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

Light bulbs/globes/tubes	Take to any Mitre 10 for specialty recycling
Cooking oil	Small amounts can be mixed in with your FOGO materials. Larger amounts must be taken take to a free Household Chemical and Paint Drop-off Depots in SA, the closest being 181 Morphett Road, North Plympton
Motor oil	Take to a free Household Chemical and Paint Drop-off Depots in SA, the closest being 181 Morphett Road, North Plympton
Chemicals / oils / paint	There are a number of free Household Chemical and Paint Drop-off Depots in SA, the closest being 181 Morphett Road, North Plympton

#### **BUILDING MATERIALS**

Bricks / rocks / pebbles / corrugated iron etc

#### **OTHER**

Tyres	Drop-off at your nearest transfer station
Medicines / syringes / sharps	Contact your local pharmacy for disposal options <b>DO NOT</b> place these items down the drain
Xrays	These can be recycled through some Jones Radiology centres
Mattresses	Include in your free on-call hard waste collection

### HARD WASTE COLLECTIONS

Each household can book one hard waste collection per financial year by calling Council's Waste Contractor on 8295 5077.

#### WHAT WILL BE COLLECTED

- √ Furniture
- Electronic Waste (TVs, computers, printers, phones, DVD & VCR players, stereos, iPods etc)
- ✓ Mattresses
- Refrigerators and freezers (for safety reasons please remove doors)
- White goods
- Floor coverings (up to 1.5 metre lengths)
- Sheets of iron and guttering (up to 1.5 metre lengths)
- Timber off-cuts (up to 1.5 metre lengths)
- Dismantled clothes lines
- Slinds and window covers
- Bikes and toys
- ✓ Air-conditioners
- ✓ Hot water services
- Lawn mowers
- Rainwater tanks (up to 1.5 metre lengths)

#### WHAT WON'T BE COLLECTED

- Ceramics, bricks, pavers, concrete and building materials
- Green organic waste (grass clippings and garden waste)
- Wooden pallets
- Motor vehicle tyres
- Items too heavy for two people to lift
- Batteries
- Paints
- Ammunition
- Explosives or flares
- Asbestos
- Fire extinguishers
- Motor oil
- Gas bottles
- Any liquids
- Chemicals
- Car parts
- Unbroken glass and shower screens

Materials can only be placed on the kerb up to 24 hours before your scheduled collection.

#### PROPERTY BEING DEMOLISHED?

for the bins to be collected. Once the property is developed and occupied, contact our waste contractor on 82955077 to arrange to deliver new bins.
